

Lanman Museum Environmental policy

The Lanman Museum's environmental mission is to operate the museum in a way that follows best environmental practice, minimises our environmental footprint and encourages sustainable behaviour.

The Museum is an accredited museum of local history. We are engaged in the storage, collection, public viewing, research and communications associated with local history and artefacts in the Museum.

This policy will be reviewed periodically to ensure its ongoing suitability for the Museum.

Scope, aims and objectives

1. Ensure as a minimum standard, full compliance with relevant environmental legislation and other regulations applicable to UK Government departments and Arm's Length Bodies relating to the sustainable use and protection of natural resources.
2. Raise awareness of our environmental impacts, environmental conditions that can affect how we operate and legislation applying to our activities.
3. Minimise our environmental impact to the maximum extent practicable in operation and management of the museum, and preservation and display of exhibits.
4. Give proper consideration to the impact on the environment before committing major expenditure or entering into any new venture or project.
5. Carry out periodic reviews of environmental management performance and monitor progress against objectives and continual improvement.
6. The Lanman Museum is located within Framlingham Castle, maintained and operated by English Heritage, and thus the environment in which the Museum operates is governed by English Heritage, whose Environmental Policy can be found at <https://www.english-heritage.org.uk/about/our-policies-and-reports/>. The Museum will support this policy as appropriate.
